

30 Children's **Rights**

Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club Fee Update

Over the years we have worked hard to keep fees the same despite increased staffing, food and resourcing costs and significant challenges around school funding. Unfortunately, we are now in a position where we have no alternative but to increase our fees in order to continue to provide the level of service our families expect. From Tuesday 9th January, the charge for Breakfast Club will increase to £2.50 per session per child and Afterschool Club will increase to £12 per





Children's Writing Corner




