




World Book Day 2024







Caring For Our Toilets Competition

Dear Steve Barclay MP
Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs

I am writing to you as me and my classmates are concerned about the effects of pollution. I have seen how vulnerable many children's health becomes. We need a better future. What you do will gradually change our world?

We pupils worry about climate change and the Greenhouse Effect. In free time we discuss possible resolutions. Though not our job, many creative people in our school have come up with ideas which could help stop it. For example, we thought about using magnetism to power cars rather than fossil fuels.

We would like you to consider your obligations and respect our rights. Article 12 says we have the right to be listened to and taken seriously and Article 24 says we have the right to a clean environment. You made this contract to the UN convention in 1991 and vowed to listen to its rules.

We believe this is crucial. We are excited to hear from you and I can't wait to read your reply.
