






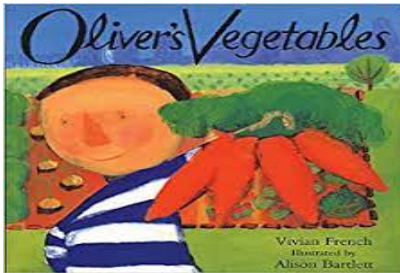
Nursery Summer 1 Home Learning Activities to Support your Child's Learning Topic: Food

	<p>When you visit local shops, choose a type of food e.g. fruit , vegetables or bread to focus on. Look at these with your child, taking time to talk about what they look like such as colour, shape, texture and see if your child knows the names of these items.</p>
	<p>Make a shopping list with your child. Encourage them to draw pictures for the items and then model writing the words to go with this , drawing their attention to the letters and words.</p>
	<p>Make a fruit smoothie or fruit kebab. Encourage your child to make choices about the different fruits to include.</p>

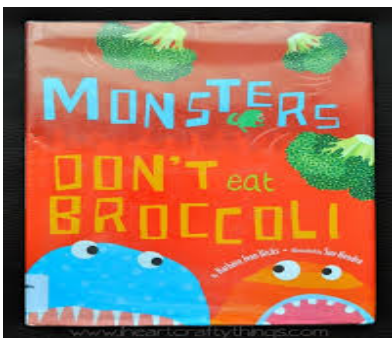

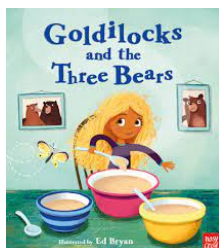
