Here is an overview of the curriculum covered in Summer 2. This can be used as a guidance of how to help your child at home. If you require any further information, please contact your class teacher.



English

<u>Core English Texts:</u> Children will be reading **'The Stone Age Boy'** and **'The Lost Word**

• Explore settings and relationships within the story

- Have opportunities to get into role to do drama
- Explore and develop ideas through talk and writing
- Write descriptions and poems

Grammar & Spelling

Bird' where they will:

We will be learning to:

 Use a variety of simple organisational devices e.g. arrows, lines, boxes, keys, to indicate sequences and relationships

How to help at home: Listen to your child read for 15 minutes every day or share a story with them. Talk to them about what they have read.



Mathematics

The children will be completing their unit in 'Time' and learning about 'Statistics and Position & Direction': This will include:

- Explore minutes in an hour
- Explore hours in a day
- Drawing and interpreting pictograms, tally charts and tables
- Describe movement
- Describe turns
- Identify patterns in shapes, using my knowledge of movement and turns.

How to help at home: Use online programs such as Sumdog and TT Rockstars to consolidate learning.



Religious Education

This half term our focus will continue to be: **'Where do some people talk to God?'**

We will be learning about:

- Where different people talk to God
- Why different people might pray in special places
- Where different religions pray
- Places of worship

How to help at home: Talk to your child about how and where people pray or non-religious people meditate.



History

This term we will be learning about 'The Stone Age'

- How did our human ancestors come to Great Britain?
- Hunters and Gatherers
- What do we mean by pre-historic?
- Skara Brae
- Stonehenge

Science

How to help at home: Talk to your child about the differences and similarities in life in the Stone Age and in their lives today.



Personal, Social, Health and Economic

Children will learn to:

- Identify changes that are out of their control and how to deal with this
- Recap the stages of human life

This half term we will focus on 'Changing Me'.

- Understand that as your grow older, you become more independent
- Identify physical differences between genders
- Explore and express emotions relating to next year.

How to help at home: Talk to your child about any worries they have about growing older and changes that they might be worried about.



This term we will be learning about 'Plants'.

Children will use their knowledge of living things to help support them to be able to:

- Identify and describe basic features of a variety of plants
- Recap what plants need to grow
- Observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow
- Experiment with water, temperature and sunlight and their impact on a plants growth.

How to help at home: Grow a plant at home and change the variables to gather information on what plants need to grow and mature.



Computing

We will be learning about **'Creating Media - Digital Photography'** We will:

- Explore the concept of landscape and portrait
- Discuss what makes a good picture
- Create using effects
- Look at images and be able to distinguish between what is real and what is not.

How to help at home: Look at different pictures with your child and discuss the lighting and the effect this has on these images.



Physical Education

We will be focusing on 'Athletics' and 'Invasion Games' Children will learn to:

- Jump and land safely
- Balance when running and how to run fast
- Use different techniques to tackle different obstacles
- Develop throwing from a distance
- Improve their hand-eye-coordination.

How to help at home: Practise throwing, jumping and running. Talk to your children about how they can improve these using the techniques that they are learning at home.



Art & Music

<u>Art</u> - **Prehistoric art** - recreate the style of cave artists using charcoal and natural colours. Pupils will experiment with colour mixing, and creating large-scale artworks, enhancing both their artistic skills and historical knowledge.

Music - 'Reflect, Rewind and Replay'

- Using our voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and rhymes
- Listening and appraising various songs
- Playing instruments, improvising, composing and performance with the song.
