#### **Mathematics**

#### Core English Text: 'Varjak Paw' by SF Said.

This half term we will be:

- Exploring themes and issues, and developing and sustaining ideas through discussion.
- Exploring and developing empathy for characters
- Writing with confidence for real purposes and audiences including writing news reports.

#### Grammar:

We will work on:

- Using apostrophes correctly, commas, subordinate clauses.
- Using collective nouns.
- Using joined-up handwriting starting on the line.
- Using a range of interesting and appropriate vocabulary including adjectives and adverbs.

We will also continue to:

- Developing reading fluently and with expression.
- Summarising stories.
- Focusing on comprehension: looking at reading for understanding.

This term your children will be very busy mathematicians. They will learn:

- The 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 times tables and division facts.
- Problem solve using money.
- Tell the time using digital and analogue clocks.
- Solving, justifying and explaining in all their mathematical activities
- Position and direction.
- Describing movements on grids.
- Properties of shape.
- Measuring angles.
- Symmetry.
- Interpreting charts and line graphs.
- Each fortnight, the children will be improving their arithmetic skills.

# Physical Education

#### <u>History</u> - Pre-history
