The choir are enjoying their participation in the Intergenerational music project with Priscilla Wakefield House. They have enjoyed singing, dancing and making music together.

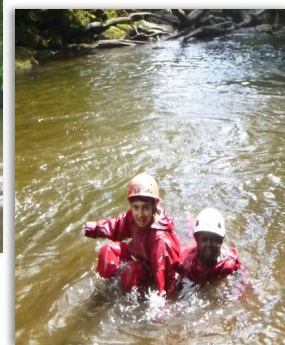

Book Recommendation

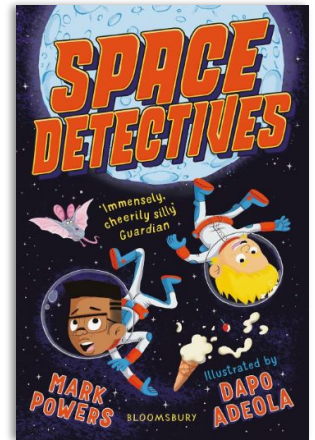
Space Detectives by Mark Powers

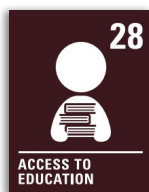
