	Lots of baby animals are born in the spring. Draw a picture of your favourite animal and label or write some sentences about them.		Look out of your window. How many birds can you see outside? Make a daily chart to show how many birds you can see each day.		In spring, lots of flowers grow. Draw or paint a picture of a flower.
	Make a healthy meal with your adult. Make a plan of what you are going to make using pictures and sentences. Then make it.		Create a number blocks poster of all the different ways of making numbers to ten.		Make a weather chart to show what the weather is like each day. What was your favourite day? Draw or paint a picture of the weather.
	Practise using your sounds to write a letter to your favourite friend.		Using 2d shapes, make a flower. What shapes did you use? Can you see these shapes in your environment?		Go for a walk with a grown-up and look for signs of spring. Talk about what you can see. Can you spot any flowers growing? Did you see any animals? Draw a picture of what you see on your spring walk
	Use recyclable materials around your home and make a Spring picture. Write about what you have made.		Memory Game! Get your adult to collect 10 small objects from around the house and put them on a tray. Close your eyes while one object is removed. Can you guess what object is missing?		With help from an adult, cut up fruits and vegetables into pieces. Arrange them on a plate to make a picture. Then eat them.
	Have a picnic lunch outside in the garden or park with your favourite toy. Write about what you ate and where you went.		Do you know the song 'Ten Green Bottles'? Try singing it with a grown up. You could use some empty plastic bottles to count as you sing the song https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TfzzCTpi_mOU		With your adult, make scrambled eggs for breakfast. Look at the mixture before and after it is cooked. Talk about how it has changed when cooked.
