Ms Maggie has worked in schools for many years and is passionate about advocating for children and families.




Write Stuff



We are excited to launch The Write Stuff in Y2-Y6 this term.

This writing approach uses "sentence stacking" to help pupils build high-quality writing using rich vocabulary and precise grammar.

The children are already enjoying using the "Writing Rainbow" to bring their stories and reports to life – ask them which "lens" they used in class today!

The lessons are carefully planned so that all children can access the learning. They are broken into smaller chunks, so it helps children break their learning down, and teachers can see where children need more help or more challenge, earlier in the lesson.

Haringey Music Service


